



Landmark Association Plaques

- 1) These plaques are strictly honorary; they do not carry with them any protection under the law. The only current protection for properties is if they are located in a zoned historic district (currently in Bowling Green—Upper East Main, Downtown Commercial District, St. Joseph’s, College Hill, Magnolia, and Shake Rag). This zoning is administered by the Bowling Green Historic Preservation Board, a branch of the City-County Planning Commission. Properties not in a district can be identified individually as a local Landmark through this board. - 2) The plaques are not a sign that the home is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. To have your home listed on the National Register, you should also contact Monica Ramsey at 270-842-1953.
- 3) Your application will be reviewed once we do receive it. If approved, someone will come by and take a drive-by photo of the house for our files. This is simply for documentation and only an exterior photo is needed. If the application provides inadequate information relating to the age of the house it will be returned with suggestions for clarifying that matter. Any application that is denied due to lack of sufficient evidence of age or due to poor condition of the property will be returned with a refund of the plaque fee.

The plaques are \$35 a piece. They are custom made for the Association by Louisville Stoneware. They are ceramic, so care must be taken when mounting them to a sturdy surface.
